This World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, join Respecting Elders: Communities Against Abuse (RECAA), the Aging + Communication + Technologies (ACT) Lab, and other Montreal organizations in a "knit-in" (a warmer and wiser take on the classic sit-in protest) and letter-writing campaign. This event is organized to make it clear to our politicians that we need immediate, transformative changes in the long-term care system.

For the past months, RECAA and ACT members, as well as people from the surrounding community, have been knitting, crocheting and sewing pieces to remember the thousands of elders and caregivers who suffered and died during the pandemic, and to act for the survivors. There will be an exhibition of the work done so far, and we will be there knitting in solidarity.

The letter writing campaign will address Premier François Legault, Health Minister Christian Dubé, and Minister of Health and Seniors Sonia Bélanger to call for continued support and accountability for reforms in Home Care and Long-Term Care Facilities.

The last few years have shed light on heartbreaking conditions of ignorance and neglect in elder care. A healthy society respects its elders. We have the right to live in safety and good health. We have the right to be heard.

Read an excerpt from our letter to the Premier and Ministers:

Within the first year of the pandemic, Quebec registered over 5,000 deaths in its long-term care network. Underfunding and ageism have created a system that is neglectful and abusive, a system that set the conditions for these deaths and the suffering of so many more.

The causes, as well as recommendations for systemic and urgent change of the long-term care network in Quebec, were outlined in the report "Ensemble vers la bientraitance," published by Handicap Vie Dignité in 2018, well before the pandemic.

Reports since the pandemic have verified well-known facts: Too many seniors are placed in ill-equipped, understaffed and antiquated facilities. Support staff receive a minimum training with most having to work in several long-term care facilities in order to make a living income.

Will the system only change cosmetically, or will there be concrete actions and oversight to overhaul it?
